### Portfolio definition:

The University of the Arts London gives the following definition of an application portfolio:

A portfolio is a collection of your work, which shows how your skills and ideas have developed over a period of time. It demonstrates your creativity, personality, abilities and commitment, and helps us to evaluate your potential

### What is a portfolio?

In 1992, Arter and Spandel indicated that the term portfolio had become a popular buzz word; however, they stressed that it was not always clear what was meant or implied by the term, particularly when used in the context of portfolio assessment. These authors offered the following definition:

. . . a purposeful collection of student work that tells the *story* of the student's efforts, progress, or achievement in (a) given area{s.}). This collection must include student participation in selection of portfolio content; the guidelines for selection; the criteria for judging merit; and evidence of student self-reflection. (Arter and Spandel, 1992: 36)

### How are portfolios used?

The use of the portfolio is an educative process in itself. This is because the development of the portfolio of work to be assessed and the submission of this work is a phase in ongoing learning. The portfolio of work remains a factor in activity. The evidence in the form of the product of the portfolio is a demonstration of learning but at the same time requires the student to develop important insights. skills, strategies, dispositions and understandings continuing learning.
